



## Weather Delays and Closures

As all of you are likely aware, we recently had a significant snow and ice storm here in Annapolis that shut down NSA Annapolis and the Naval Academy for multiple days as well as closed local schools for the entire week. Looking ahead, I wanted to share information with you all to ensure you are up-to-date on potential delays and closures in the future. If you are not already, please follow the information below to get connected.

### NSAA/USNA

For NSAA AtHoc alerts, register your work or personal contact information to receive official alerts at this [link](#). You can also go to the NSA Annapolis website, click on Operations and Management, Emergency Management, and the link is located there. These alerts will keep you informed of what is happening on base including weather delays and closures. Additionally, if you utilize any of the child care on base, you can receive notifications for the CDCs and Youth Center by signing up for your center's Remind App. Please ask your center for their Remind classroom code and be sure to join in case of future weather or other unforeseen events.

For Naval Academy families, check the USNA weather and operations webpages for additional information.

### AACPS

The fastest way to get Anne Arundel County Public Schools (AACPS) weather alerts is by downloading the free AACPS mobile app, which sends notifications regarding closures and delays. You can also sign up for email or text alerts through the school district's official notification system. According to AACPS, email and text messages are sent as soon as possible after decisions are made. Phone calls on the same morning of a schedule alteration are sent beginning at 5:30 a.m. When decisions are made the night before a school day, calls are sent as soon as possible. As we saw this past week, AACPS may choose to delay start, close, or use virtual learning. Under state law, school systems may not switch to virtual learning during inclement weather unless they have utilized all inclement weather days built into their school year calendar. AACPS has three inclement weather days built into the calendar. If they occur, shifts to virtual learning are announced by AACPS.
